To support her she will be recruiting and training a multifaith volunteer team to help the retail workers in the Wharf.



In October Revd. Fiona Stewart-Darling participated in the **Ethical Finance conference in Edinburgh**. She was invited to take part in a panel discussion exploring 'aligning investments with values'. As panel members we represented the Jewish, Muslim and Christian faiths. During the conference the Edinburgh Finance Declaration, which is a Shared Values Framework for Ethical Finance was launched. It is hoped to launch in London in 2019.



In May, the Chaplaincy had the first session in the **new Ethics Series - Leadership and Values** - hosted by Clifford Chance and organized jointly in partnership by the Chaplaincy and representatives from the financial and professional services institutions based on the Wharf.
