ANUARY

- O1 Gantan-sai Start of three day celebrations to mark the New Year.
- 01 Birth of Guru Gobind Singh Tenth Sikh Guru and the last one in human form; founded the Brotherhood of the Pure (Khalsa).
- 05 Birthday of Holy Mother Sarada Devi Commemorates the birthday of the Hindu mystic and saint.
- **06 Epiphany** Celebrates the visit of the Three Wise Men (Magi) to the infant
- 50 Of Christmas Day (celebrated in Ethiopia) Celebrated on this day to coincide with Christmas in Ethiopia.
- **07 Christmas Day (Eastern Orthodox)** Celebrated on this day by Eastern Orthodox Christians.
- 12 Birthday of Swami Vivekananda Celebrates the birth of one of the most celebrated spiritual leaders of India.
- **14 Maghi/Lohri** Celebrates the sacrifice of the 40 Sikhs who fought for Guru Gorbind & is celebrated with bonfires.
- **27 Tu B'Shevat** Marks the beginning of the 'new year' for trees.
 - **28 Holocaust Memorial Day** Remembering the millions of people killed in the Holocaust.

FEBRUARY

- **02 Imbolc** Honours the goddess Brigid and marks the return of Spring.
- **O2 Candlemas** Commemorates the presentation of the baby Jesus in the Jerusalem Temple and the purification of his mother after giving birth.
- **03 Setsubun** Part of the Spring festival with special ritual to ward off evil.
- 12 Chinese New Year Year of the Ox Most important of the traditional Chinese holidays.
- **15 Parinirvana** Celebration to mark the final passing of the Buddha (may be celebrated by some on 8th February instead depending on culture).
- 16 Saraswati Puja Celebrating the Goddess Saraswati the goddess of
- **16 Shrove Tuesday** The day of preparation for Lent (the 40 days leading up to Easter), traditionally marked by eating pancakes.
- **17 Ash Wednesday** First day of Lent. Many Christians receive a cross of ash on their foreheads in church as a symbol of mortality and penance.
- 25-28 Ayyám-i-Há Intercalary days.
- 25 Nineteen Day Fast Adults fast from sunrise to sunset for 19 days; important time for prayer, reflection and spiritual renewal.

- **01 St David's Day** Commemorates the patron Saint of Wales.
- **10 Isra and Mi'raj** Commemorates the Prophet Muhammad's journey from Mecca to Jerusalem and his ascent into heaven.
- **11 Maha Shivaratri** Festival celebrated in reverence of Lord Shiva.
- **15 Birthday of Sri Ramakrishna** Celebrating the birth of the Hindu incarnation of God.
- **17 St Patrick's Day** Commemorates the patron Saint of Ireland.
- **20 Spring Equinox** Celebration of Spring.
- **21-22** Naw-Rúz End of the 19 day fast and the beginning of the Baha'i New
- **26 Purim** Celebration of Jewish deliverance as told in the Book of Esther.
- **26 Khordad Sal** Celebrating the birth date of Zoroaster.
- **28 Magha Puja** Takes place on the full moon day commemorating the life of the Buddha.
- 28 Birthday of Sri Chaitanya Mahaprabhu Celebrating the birth of the Hindu mystic and saint.
- **28 Palm Sunday** The first day of Holy Week, commemorating Jesus' triumphal arrival in Jerusalem before his arrest and death.
- **29-30 Holi** Festival of Colour marking the end of winter.

APRIL

- **01 Maundy Thursday** Commemorates the Last Supper.
- **04 Easter Day** Christians celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead. The Easter season lasts for 50 days to Pentecost.

O2 Good Friday Commemorates the death of Jesus by crucifixion.

- Hanamatsuri Flower festival celebrating the birthday of Shakyamuni, whose teachings form the basis of Buddhism.
- **08 Yom HaShoah** Anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto uprising, serves as a day of remembrance for those who perished in the Shoah (Holocaust).
- **08 Wesak** Celebration of Buddha's enlightenment.
- **13 Vaisakhi** Marks the creation of Sikhism and the ordination of the Khalsa.
- 13 Ramadan Starts the most significant month for Muslims. Marks a period of daily fasting from dawn to sunset.

- 16-27 **Feast of Ridván** Start of festival commemorating the commencement of Baha'u'llah's prophethood.
- **21 Ram Navami** Celebrates the founding of the Khalsa, the Brotherhood of the Pure by Guru Gobind Singh.
- 23 **St George's Day** Commemorates the patron Saint of England.
- 24 Ninth Day of Ridván Day when Baha'u'llah's family joined him at the Najibiyyih Garden, Baghdad.
- **25 Mahavir Jayanti** Celebrates the birth of Lord Mahavira, the last Tirthankara (saviour).
- **27 Hanuman Jayanti** Celebrated to commemorate the birth of Hanuman.
- **28-04 Passover** Celebrates the Exodus, the freedom from slavery of the Children of Israel from ancient Egypt that followed the Ten Plagues.
- **27 Twelfth Day of Ridvan** Close of the festival.

MAY

- **01 Beltan** Celebration of fertility marking the beginning of Summer.
- **02 Easter Day (Orthodox Christianity)** Based on the Julian calendar.
- **09 Laylat al-Qadr** Marks the night in which the Qur'an was first revealed.
- **13 Ascension Day** Marks the ascension of Jesus Christ to Heaven after he rose from the dead on Easter Sunday.
- 13-14 Eid al-Fitr After the end of Ramadan with an additional morning congregational prayer in the mosque.
- **17-18 Shavuot** Celebrates the giving of the Torah (Five Books of Moses), the first harvest, and the ripening of the first fruits.
- **23-24 Declaration of the Báb** Celebrates the Báb's declaration of his mission as the messenger of God.
- **Pentecost/Whitsun** Marks the appearance of the Holy Spirit.
- **28 Ascension of Bahá'u'lláh** Commemorates death of Bahá'u'lláh, founder of the Bahá'í faith.

IUNE

- **16 Martyrdom of the Guru Arjan Dev** Commemorates the fifth Sikh Guru and first Sikh martyr.
- A 24 Midsummer's Day A celebration of the sun's power on the longest day of the year.
- 29 Feast of Saints Peter and Paul Observed by Roman Catholics, Anglicans and Lutherans.

- **09 Martyrdom of the Báb** Commemorates the Báb's execution in 1850, after which his teachings continued to spread.
- **12 Rath Yatra** Public procession and chariot festival.
- **17-22 The Hajj** Once in a lifetime pilgrimage to Makkah; is the largest gathering of Muslims anywhere in the world.
- **18 Tisha B'Av** Anniversary of the destruction of the Temple of Solomon by Nebuchadnezzar and of the Second Temple by Titus.
- **19 Yawm Arafat** 2nd day of Hajj, day of repentance and acceptance of supplications, many non pilgrims fast on this holiest day in Islam.
- ★ **20-24 Eid al-Adha** Marks the sacrifice made by Prophet Abraham.
- 23 Birthday of Emperor Halle Selassie I A holy day of commemoration for Rastafarians.
- **24 Guru Purnima Day** An Indian and Nepalese festival dedicated to spiritual and academic teachers.
- **24 Asalha-Dharma Day** Commemorates Buddha's first teaching to the five ascetics in the Deer Park near Benares, India.

AUGUST

- **01 Lughnasadh** Marks the first day of harvest.
- 09-10 First day of Muharram Start of Islamic year 1443.
- **18-19 Ashura** Marks the tenth day of Muharram as the day Allah saved Moses from the Pharaoh.
- **22 Raksha Bandhan** Celebrates the love and duty between sisters and brothers.
- **29 The Blessed Virgin Mary** Celebration of the mother of Jesus, Catholic Christians keep this day as Mary's Assumption into heaven before death.
- 30 Janmashtami Celebrates the birthday of Lord Krishna, believed to have shown himself in human form 5,000 years ago.

SEPTEMBER

- **07-08 Rosh Hashanah** The Jewish New Year, marks the start of ten days of repentance, ending on Yom Kippur.
- 10 Ganesh Chaturthi Festival that commemorates God Ganesha's
- **11 Samvatsari** Holiest day of the Jain calendar, spent in prayers and
- 🧩 11 Enkutatash The Ethiopian New Year, celebrations of prayer a<mark>nd colourful</mark>
- **16 Yom Kippur** Holiest day of the Jewish calendar, marked by a 25-hour fast and solemn prayer to repent for the previous year's sins.
- **21-26 Sukkot** Tabernacles or Feast of Booths.
 - **21 International Day of Peace** A day devoted to strengthening the ideals of peace among and within all nations.
- **22 Shūbun-Sai** A day for visiting graves.
- Autumn Equinox Ritual of thanksgiving.
- **28 Shemini Atzeret** The eighth day of Solemn Assembly.
- **29 Simchat Torah** Celebrates and marks the conclusion of the annual cycle of public Torah reading.

- **07-16 Navratri** Ten days of ceremonies, rituals, fasts and feasts in honour of the supreme mother of Goddess.
- 35 **Durga Puja-Dussehra** End of Navratri.
- 19 Lakshmi Puja Most important day of Diwali devoted to Goddess Lakshmi.
- **20 First reading of Guru Granth Sahib** The Sikh scripture is installed at the Golden Temple for the first time.
- **21-04 Mahalaya** Marks the beginning of Navratri and Durga Puja.
- 31-01 **Samhain** Marks the end of the harvest season and the beginning of winter.

NOVEMBER

- **01 All Saints Day** Honours all Saints in Christian history.
- **O2** All Souls Day Commemorates the faithful departed, family members and friends who have died.
- **Q O4 Bandi Chhor Divas** Commemorates the peaceful release of 52 kings and princes by sixth Sikh Guru (Guru Hargobind) darkness and knowledge over ignorance.
- **04 Diwali** Festival of lights symbolising the victory of light over darkness and knowledge over ignorance.
- 06-07 **Birth of the Báb** Celebrates the birthday of The Bab, forerunner, who prepared their way for Baha'u'llah. 06-07 **Birth of Bahá'u'lláh** One of the twin founders of the Baha'i faith,
 - who was born in 1817. **07-14 Inter Faith Week** A week to focus on inter faith understanding and
- 14 Remembrance Sunday Commemorating the contribution of military service people in the two World Wars and later conflicts.

- 15 **Shichi-Go-San** Festival celebrating the growth and well-being of young
- **18 Guru Nanak Gururab** Celebrates the birth of the first Sikh guru.
- **19-20 Mawlid** Observance of the birthday of prophet Muhammed. **19 Sangha Day** Celebration in honour of the Sangha, and a chance for
- people to reaffirm their commitment to Buddhist practices and traditions. **24 Martyrdom of Guru Tegh Bahadur** Commemorates the 9th Sikh guru who undertook the sacrifice for protection of the oppressed.
- **26-27 Day of the Covenant** When Bahá'is celebrate the appointment of Abdu'l-Bahá as the Centre of Baha'u'llah's Covenant.
- 28 Ascension of `Abdu'l-Bahá Commemorates the death of Abdu'l-Bahá.
- **28 Advent Sunday** The first day of the season of Advent.
 - **29-06 Chanukah** Celebrates the rededication of Jerusalem's Second Temple and the miracle of its menorah, which was kept alight for eight days with one day's oil
- **30 Saint Andrew's Day** Feast day of the patron saint of Scotland.

DECEMBER

- **8 Bodhi Day** Commemorates the day that the historical Buddha, Siddhartha Gautama (Shakyamuni) experienced enlightenment.
- 14 **Geeta Jayanti** Commemorates the birthday of Bhagvad Gita, the sacred text of Hindu.
- **24 Christmas Eve** Time for preparation for Christmas.
- **25 Christmas Day** Commemorates the birth of Jesus Christ and is widely celebrated by the exchanging of gifts
